Bill Weber is currently the Senior Officer at the Butler University Police Department where he is a day shift officer, among other responsibilities.

Prior to his current role with Butler University, Weber worked for the Indianapolis Police Department, now the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department, for 27 years. Weber began as a district officer before being promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 1994 and becoming an Accident Investigator, a Fatal Alcohol Crash Team (FACT) squad leader and a DUI Unit leader.

The DUI Unit's purpose was to make DUI arrests and to assist in crashes with suspected DUI. During the DUI Unit's existence, DUI crashes and hit and runs dropped by up to 50 percent in some areas around Indianapolis. Weber trained newly hired officers in different aspects of Indiana traffic law, including DUI enforcement and standardized field sobriety testing; Weber had ~2,000 DUI arrests during his IPD career.
